CONDOVER TRIP MEETING FOR MARCH 2022 VISIT

Covid restrictions are finally easing and the Government have finally allowed school residential visits to resume. We have arranged to take next year's Year 6 on a residential activity course to Condover Hall, Shropshire on 23rd – 25th March 2022. This is usually one of the children's primary school 'highlights' and an extremely enjoyable experience. It is well known that residential courses organised by schools are becoming increasingly invaluable as part of the National Curriculum.

The Government has stated the beneficial effects of learning outside the classroom and the impact this has on a child's progress that such courses provide. Learning outside the classroom offers new exciting challenges, children will learn to work together as a team, develop independence, confidence and an ability to recognise strengths and weaknesses in a constructive way. The value of giving children the opportunity to try our new activities cannot be underestimated.

At Condover Hall, fully trained and qualified instructors, with the support of school staff, provide instruction in a full programme of activities in a safe, controlled and secure environment.

The activities available may include: Archery, High Rope Course, Fencing, Golf, Zip Wire, Zorbing, to name but a few.

The total cost of the visit to Condover Hall is approximately **£198.03** and includes: Full board accommodation, transport from the school to the centre and return, insurance, all instruction and activities, equipment & safety equipment, evening activities programme, achievement certificates and comprehensive insurance.

To apply for a place for your child, please complete the consent form, and return to the office with a £35.00 deposit, which must be before Thursday 24th June 2021 in order to secure the booking. If we do not receive a deposit by this date your child will not be allocated a place. All monies can be paid in full (or in instalments) to the office by Thursday 16th December 2021

If we do not have at least 26 children participating then the trip will not be viable and will not go ahead.

Medical forms will be handed out after all deposits have been collected in and need to be returned ASAP (Friday 16th July 2021).

We will send more information nearer the time of the visit. This will give you the final details of the trip and any queries can be answered.

PAYMENTS

Condover March 2022

I confirm that I will pay the total cost of £198.03 for the residential activity visit and enclose a £35.00 deposit.

I understand that the deposit is not returnable once my child's place has been confirmed.

I will adhere to the payment plan below:

- Initial deposit **£35.00** by Thursday 24th June 2021
- **£35.00** on or before Thursday 15th July 2021
- **£35.00** on or before Thursday 30th September 2021
- **£35.00** on or before Thursday 21st October 2021
- **£35.00** on or before Thursday 25th November 2021
- **£23.03** on or before Thursday 16th December 2021

As the school has to make regular instalments to JCA, the office will contact parents/guardians if payments are not made by the above dates.

Cancellation charge per paying child

69 days prior to departure: 60% of total trip cost for the individual

28 days prior to departure: 80% of total trip cost for the individual

14 days to departure date: 100% of total trip cost for the individual

We appreciate that each instalment appears to be a large amount in a short space of time. We usually arrange payment over a 10 month period, however, we have been waiting for the Government to give school permission for residential visits to resume.

To make the residential visit viable we need a minimum of 26 children to attend.
