#### With their learning...

• Talk with your child about their school work, topics and the world around them.

. Hear your child read regularly and help them to learn spellings strategies.

·Visit the library and help your son/daughter to choose books to read for pleasure and to support their topics.

·Ensure your child uses Mathletics, Numbots, TTRS & Spelling Shed at home on a tablet or computer on a regular basis.

- Please check your child's planner daily.
- Sign the planner every week (at the bottom of the page) so that we know homework has been completed and that all communication between home and school has been shared.

#### With practical issues...

- Ensure that your child has the correct P.E. Kit in school every day.
- Children should wear a tie with winter uniform.

#### <u>English</u>

This term, our **writing** will be inspired by the text 'The Boyhood of Burglar Bill' by Allan Ahlberg, which describes life in the 1950s in Oldbury. We will concentrate on developing sentence structure and punctuation through a variety of genres including the correct and appropriate use of Alan Peat Sentences (APS). Our **reading** will focus on vocabulary, phonics, fluency and expression. **Comprehension** will be developed through targeted questioning and reading journal activities. Weekly **spelling** tests will be taking place. Children have been

given a copy of the spellings in their green spelling books which should be taken home daily. The children will be assessed through dictation and written work.

#### <u>Maths</u>

In Maths, all aspects of the National Curriculum will be covered. In particular, we will be working on fluency of maths, rapid recall of times tables, the 4 operations, fractions, real life problems and reasoning. Mathletics, Numbots and TT Rock Stars are valuable resources that the school pay for to complement your child's learning: homework will continue to be set weekly. Please ensure it is completed **by Tuesday.** 

**D&T** We will be developing our creativity by designing gift packaging and cooking a local delicacy!

<u>Art</u> In art, the children will be developing their use of mixed media while studying local canal artwork.

#### **PE** The children will be focusing on gymnastics and cricket. PE is on Friday for 5/6B & 5/6R and on Wednesday for 5/6D. (Track suit advisable.)

#### <u>Music</u>

In music, we will be developing our rhythm and composition skills through percussion instruments. We will also be learning and performing a new song.
