# How can you help your child?

## With their learning...

- · Talk with your child about their school work, topics and the world around them.
- · Hear your child read regularly and help them to learn spellings strategies.
- · Visit the library and help your son/daughter to choose books to read for pleasure and to support their topics.
- Ensure your child uses Mathletics, TTRS, Numbots & Spelling Shed at home on a tablet or computer on a regular basis.
  - Please check your child's planner daily.
  - Sign the planner every week (at the bottom of the page) so that we know homework has been completed and that all communication between home and school has been shared.

## With practical issues...

- · Ensure that your child has the correct P.E. Kit in school every day.
- · Children should wear a tie with winter uniform.
- · Children should not wear nail varnish or jewellery (other than a watch and / or stud earrings) for school.
- Don't forget that if your child wishes to have their ears pierced, the best time is the beginning of the summer holidays as it is

## Year 6 Groups

On Tuesday afternoons, Year 6 will continue to have the opportunity to work in smaller groups to build their skills and confidence for the end of KS2 tests. Mr Baker and Miss Stanton will be teaching these sessions. While these take place, Year 5 will be investigating a new topic of Ancient Egypt. This will be with Mr Raybould & Mrs Oliver.

## Geography

In geography, we will be locating rivers of the world, following the journey of a river, mapping rivers and studying waterfalls.

## Computing

In computing, we will be looking at coding and learn more about how computers use property values and parameters to store information about objects. As part of 'Information Technology', we will be using a range of well-known software, developing their computer skills.

#### Music

Children will be introduced to 'Chords' and 'Identifying Important Musical Elements,' celebrating a wide range of musical styles. Key areas will include Listening, Singing, Playing, Composing and Performing.

#### Science

This term we will be exploring the theory of 'Evolution and Variation' and how inherited characteristics can vary in species. Year 5 will learn about a range of 'Forces' Children will continue to develop Working Scientifically skills.

#### RE

In RE, we will build on previous learning as we resume our reflections on different beliefs, traditions, and questions surrounding the afterlife from a range of religious perspectives in Summer I.

## **PSHE**
