How can you help your child? With their learning...

- ✓ Talk with your child about their school work, topics and the world around them.
- ✓ Hear your child read regularly and help them to learn spellings strategies.
- ✓ Visit the library and help your son/daughter to choose books to read for pleasure and to support their topics.
- ✓ Encourage them to use Mathletics and Spelling Shed at home on a tablet or computer.
- ✓ Play Numbots to improve speed and accuracy of basic number facts.
- ✓ Please check your child's planner daily.
- ✓ Sign the planner every week (at the bottom of the page) so that we know homework has been completed and that all communication between home and school has been shared.
- ✓ Please help your child with using the resources in the planners. For example; the phonics mat, common exception words and number square. (Pages 8,9, 19, 20, 25, 26, 27, 29, 31 are the most relevant for Year I)

With practical issues...

- ✓ Ensure that your child has the correct P.E. Kit in school every day.
- \checkmark Children should wear a tie with winter uniform.
- ✓ Summer Uniform can be worn, if preferred.
- ✓ Children should not wear nail varnish or jewellery (other than a watch and / or stud earrings) for school.
- ✓ Don't forget that if your child wishes to have their ears pierced, the best time is the beginning of the summer holidays as it is Dudley policy that children cannot wear any kind of earrings during PE lessons.
- \checkmark Long hair should be tied up for safety reasons.
- \checkmark Please ensure that all uniform is marked with the child's name.

A reminder...

English

Our topic will inspire our writing styles to include stories with familiar settings, information texts, fact files and recounts. We will be completing the teaching of YI punctuation and grammar, and applying this to increasingly independent writing.

We encourage strong home / school links. Please use the reading section of your child's planner to record your child's reading at home. Your support is greatly appreciated.

Math

We follow the National Curriculum and use a concrete, pictorial, abstract approach (CPA). This term we will be looking at: Multiplication and Division, Fractions, Position and Direction, Place Value to 100, Solving Problems, Money and Time.

Please use our online tools weekly — NumBots and Mathletics. NumBots follows your child's individual progress so is accessible for all, at all times. Please note we will only assign activities on Mathletics when they closely match our taught topics. However, Mathletics is currently set to 'open' so all activities can be accessed, if you wish.

Science

We will be looking at 'Plants'. We will be looking at common plants and trees, the difference between deciduous and evergreen trees and we will investigate the basic structure of both flowering plants and trees.

We will continue to look at seasonal changes with a focus on Spring and Summer, and how weather changes throughout the year.

Geography

The focus of our geography lessons this term is to develop our knowledge of the local area and to investigate and create our own maps. We will recap human and physical features as well as creating symbols and keys to match our own maps. We will also revisit the 4 countries of the UK and their capitals.

History

We will be conducting a 'Heritage Project' where we will be investigating and exploring the history of Blanford Mere Primary School, the site on which we are located and changes in the local area. As part of our 'Sea' theme we will also explore the life of Grace Darling.
