Changes due to COVID

Early Years Foundation Stage

The Early Years Foundation Stage is broken down into 7 different areas of development. Children should mostly develop the 3 prime areas first. These are

- PSED
- ► Communication and Language
- Physical Development

As children grow the prime areas will help them to develop skills in 4 specific areas. These are

- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the world
- Expressive arts and design

Topics and Themes in Nursery

- All based around children's interests.
- ► In the moment planning.
- Open ended resources no plastic etc.

End of Year Expectations

- ▶ Reading: Children listen to stories with increasing attention and recall describing main story settings, events and characters in books. Children can hear and say the initial sounds in words and beginning to segment the sounds in simple words and blend them together.
- Writing: Children give meaning to marks they make as they draw, write and paint. They can form some of the letters in their own name correctly.
- Number: Children count reliably with numbers from zero to ten and use number names accurately in play. They sometimes match numeral and quantity correctly and recognise numbers 0-5.
- ▶ Shape, Space and Measures: Children show an interest in shape and space by playing with shapes and making arrangements with them. Children are beginning to use mathematical names for 2D shapes and show an interest in shapes in the environment.
