How can you help your child?

With their learning...

- · Talk with your child about their school work, topics and the world around them.
- · Hear your child read regularly and help them to learn spellings strategies.
- · Visit the library and help your son/daughter to choose books to read for pleasure and to support their topics.
- · Ensure your child uses Mathletics, TTRS, Numbots & Spelling Shed at home on a tablet or computer on a regular basis.
 - Please check your child's planner daily.
 - Sign the planner every week (at the bottom of the page) so that we know homework has been completed and that all communication between home and school has been shared.

With practical issues...


- · Ensure that your child has the correct P.E. Kit in school every day.
- · Children should wear a tie with winter uniform.

In geography, the children will be developing their understanding of India, United States of America and comparing landscapes for film sets. They will learn about latitude, longitude and time zones.




History

Science

English

We will continue to develop sentence structure and punctuation through a variety of genres including the correct and appropriate use of Alan Peat Sentences (APS).

Maths

In Maths, all aspects of the National Curriculum will be covered. In particular, we will be working on fluency of maths, rapid recall of times tables, the 4 operations, fractions, real life problems and reasoning. Mathletics is a valuable resource that the school pays for to complement your child's learning: homework will continue to be set weekly online. Please ensure it is completed **before Tuesday**.

PSHE

The children will be studying 'Living in the wider world.' We will be looking at how to protect the environment, showing compassion to others, online information and identifying job interests.
