

Prior knowledge

Previously, children will have used their sketchbooks to explore artists. They will have learnt how to make notes about their ideas and begun to reflect and evaluate the process of making. Children will have explored a range of colours and media and learnt that art can be inspired from artists from the past and see it as a way of expressing emotions.

National Curriculum Objectives

Year 56 will learn about the Mayan calendar and the symbols used to represent the days and months. Having made notes in their sketchbooks, they will create abstract black and white artwork using the symbols as inspiration. Year 56 will use wooden pegs and wool to design and create their own Worry Doll as inspired the Guatemalan tradition.
