#### Topic overview

Paddington's Adventures Exploring London through the architecture of Sir Christopher Wren

### Prior knowledge

Previously, children will have explored making 3D sculptures through modelling with a range of media. Understand that sculpture is the name sometimes given for artwork which exists in three dimensions. Sculptures have also been tried and tested through their play.

# National Curriculum Objectives

Year Two will their knowledge of sculpture and learn that when we add materials together it is called **construction**. They will explore the role of an **architect**. They will playfully use cutting, tying and sticking to follow a brief to construct their own building.



# By the end of this unit, I will be able to:

Drawing - Understand that we can hold our drawing tools in a variety of ways, experimenting with pressure, grip and speed to affect line.

Sketchbooks - Continue to build understanding that sketchbooks are places for personal experimentation.

Making/3D - Understand the role of an architect. Use cutting, tying and sticking to construct their own building following their own individual ideas.
