

COMPUTING

Year group: 1

Term: Spring



Topic overview

The children will have a weekly one hour lesson in the Computing suite where they will develop their Information Technology, Computer Science and Digital Literacy skills using a range of apps and software packages. There will be additional and frequent opportunities to apply their IT skills across the curriculum and to learn how to stay safe online.

Prior knowledge

In Autumn term, they will have learnt how to log on, complete a simple task, enter text, use a mouse and save their work (with support).

They will have a basic understanding of what an algorithm is and will have begun logical decision making and learnt how to sequence instructions.

They will know some basic internet safety rules, including how to use passwords and to tell a trusted adult if they encounter any concerning content or contact online.
